Quick Snapshot

- Founded:** Philabundance was founded in 1984. In 2005, Philabundance integrated with the Greater Philadelphia Food Bank to become the region's largest hunger relief organization.
- Service Area:** Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia Counties in Pennsylvania and Western Burlington, Camden, Gloucester and Salem Counties in New Jersey.
- Food Distribution:** In fiscal 2009, 17 million pounds were distributed in the Delaware Valley, reaching approximately 65,000 people per week.
- Who We Serve:** A network of 500 member agencies, including food cupboards, shelters, residential programs, social service agencies, emergency kitchens, neighborhood/church distribution programs.
- Who is in Need:** 900,000 low income residents rely on Philabundance each year, 23% are children and 16% are seniors
- Sources of Food:** National and local food manufacturers, wholesalers, growers, importers, retailers, brokers and food distributors donate food to Philabundance.
