Today, we have created the Justice for the Hungry campaign, a friendly competition in the law community to see who can raise the most funds and food in support of Philabundance. The Work of Philabundance

Philabundance was founded on the simple belief that no one should go hungry while healthy food goes to waste. Our mission is to drive hunger from our communities today and to end hunger for good.



COUNTIES

We serve 5 counties in Pennsylvania: Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia; and 4 counties in New Jersey: Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, and Salem.



POUNDS

In 2025, we distributed over 40 million pounds of food throughout our service area.



COMMUNITY PARTNERS

We directly serve over 300 community focused organizations and provide additional food resources through lead agencies that reach another 300 partners.



PEOPLE

Philabundance serves about 100,000 households each week.



MEALS

Every \$1 donated can provide up to 2 meals.
