Dear Friends of Philabundance,

Each year, our communities are put to the test—sometimes in ways we can predict and plan for, and in other ways that require innovative responses. This past year, we faced challenges that reverberated throughout food banks across the nation: the sudden cancellation of more than \$1 billion in federal funding, including the elimination of the Local Food Purchase Assistance program and significant cuts to The Emergency Food Assistance Program—two pillars of emergency hunger relief that food banks across the country had depended upon. For Philabundance, this meant confronting difficult decisions about how to sustain our mission when the resources we’d relied upon were no longer guaranteed.

### **But uncertainty was not inaction.**

Instead, our commitment to our neighbors grew stronger. Because though funding may fluctuate, sadly, we know that hunger remains. The families who turn to us for support—the parents making impossible choices between groceries and rent, the seniors stretching limited incomes, the children who depend on us for their next meal—need us now more than ever.

This year demanded resilience, creativity, and an unwavering belief in our mission. It required us to examine our operations, strengthen our partnerships, and lean more heavily on the generosity of our donors of funds and food. And you responded with extraordinary compassion. Your donations, your advocacy, and your volunteer hours were the fuel that moved us forward.

In this report, you’ll see how we adapted and persevered—the inventive approaches we embraced to stretch every dollar further, the partnerships that multiplied our impact, and the tens of thousands of neighbors we continued to serve with dignity and respect.

This moment in our history will be remembered not for what we lost, but for what we refused to surrender: our promise to be there for anyone facing hunger in our region.

# A LEGACY OF *Fighting Hunger*



Philabundance was founded in 1984 with a straightforward but powerful conviction: that no one in the Greater Philadelphia region should go hungry when good food goes to waste. What began as a modest effort to rescue surplus food and redirect it to people in need has grown into one of the largest hunger relief organizations in the Mid-Atlantic—a regional anchor in the fight against food insecurity.

Over more than four decades, Philabundance has weathered economic recessions, public health crises, and shifting policy landscapes, each time emerging with a stronger network and a sharper sense of purpose. Through it all, its mission has never changed: to provide food to those who need it most, with dignity and without judgment.

Today, Philabundance is a proud member of the Feeding America national network of food banks and distributes tens of millions of pounds of food annually through hundreds of community partners, reaching individuals and families across nine counties in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. But none of it would be possible without the community that has rallied around this work from the very beginning.

Donors who gave when resources were scarce. Volunteers who showed up week after week, year after year. Advocates who stood up for our hungry neighbors in halls of power.

**Our community has been the constant in an ever-changing landscape—and the reason Philabundance has been able to say, for more than 40 years, that we will be here.**

# Transforming Lives

## Philabundance Community Kitchen

In 2025, Philabundance Community Kitchen (PCK) celebrated a remarkable milestone: 25 years of transforming lives through culinary training, workforce development, and the simple but profound belief that everyone deserves a second chance. Founded in 2000, PCK was born from a vision to address hunger at its roots—not just by providing food, but by equipping people with the skills and confidence to build sustainable futures. What began in a small shared kitchen with one and a half employees has grown into a nationally accredited, 19,000-square-foot culinary training facility that serves six cohorts of students per year.

Over 25 years, PCK has graduated more than 1,100 adults, boasting an 80 percent job placement rate. But the numbers only tell part of the story. PCK transforms its students, rebuilding confidence, restoring purpose, and sending ripples of hope through entire families and communities.

None of this would have been possible without the donors and supporters who believed in this work from the beginning. Your generosity helped expand the program, construct a new facility, and ensure that more neighbors could access this life-changing opportunity.

Twenty-five years in, PCK remains one of the most powerful expressions of what Philabundance stands for: that ending hunger for good means addressing its root causes, such as joblessness, one person at a time.

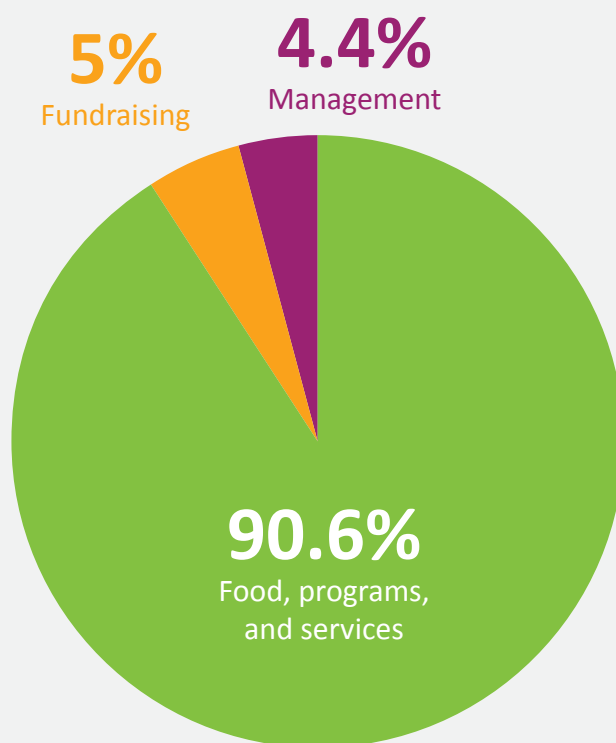
